From The Pastor

Lately, I've found myself missing my mom. It's been twelve years since she passed, and yet it feels like just yesterday. We weren't always close when I was growing up, but in my late twenties, something shifted. We began talking more—sometimes about big life questions and sometimes completely random things. I turned to her not only for advice but also because I admired her. She was a steady presence, someone who had lived more life than I had—someone I could talk to as a son, friend, and role

Growing up, I was often asked if I knew my "real mom." Even now, as an adult, that question still comes up. The problem with that question is that it erases everything my mom did—the love she gave, the care she offered, the consistent presence she was in my life after she adopted me. There's a saying that any man can be a father, but it takes someone special to be a dad. I believe the same is true for moms. My mom may not have been my birth mother, but she mothered me. She loved me into being. She is my real mom.

One of the things I respect most about her was her willingness to grow alongside me. Like many in her generation, she wasn't raised to talk about mental health. You were expected to "shake off" and move past it. But when I began to share that I was living with mental illness, she didn't turn away. She started the journey of understanding—quietly, steadily. I don't know how far she came before she passed; truthfully, it took me many years to give my own mental health the attention it deserved. But she tried. And that mattered.

May is **Mental Health Awareness Month**, and it's also the month we celebrate **Mother's Day**. I don't think that's a coincidence. I believe the two belong together. So many mothers carry immense emotional and mental weight—raising children, working, volunteering, caregiving—often while carrying their own pain silently. My mom was one of those women. She didn't always say much about her own feelings or mental health but knew when something was off. She had a way of noticing what others missed.

I remember one time in my late teens when I was (emotionally & mentally) struggling and living in San Antonio. I wasn't calling home often, and she could sense something was wrong. She called. I didn't answer. She wasn't the type to keep calling and calling, but she left a voicemail. It was simple, but I remember my mom saying something like: "I love you. You matter. You're not alone. And you need to know that." That was my mom—gentle, direct, and loving in ways that didn't always need a spotlight.

Our relationship wasn't perfect. We had our growing pains, both of us. But we also grew together. And now, when I see young adults, those my age or older who no longer make time for their parents, I think—Do they realize how sacred it is to still have that time? To make memories? To repair what's broken? To love in real-time?

As I reflect on this month, I also think of those who are grieving, who are estranged, or who carry complicated relationships with their mothers. Mental health touches every one of those stories. So does love.

Unfinished Business

- Building Improvements: the bathroom project is stalled because the city inspector had some
 questions. The inspector will provide information on the ADA requirements for compliance. Waiting
 for a response from the city. The pumps in the basement were repaired, the dishwasher
 disconnected and removed. The kitchen cabinets are on hold
- QuickBooks transition to the cloud is in progress. There is a meeting tomorrow with the consultant to review the agreed upon format and provide an update on the migration. A training session will be scheduled and recorded.

New Business:

- We are moving in a new direction with the music ministry. Our pianist has indicated that she will not
 continue beyond May. It allows us an opportunity to re-envision. Pastor requires approval to hire a
 music director, it has been approved by Personnel. The director position would call for a single
 person to play the organ, piano, and lead choir rehearsal. Additionally, it would eliminate the music
 coordinator position. The pay will range based on experience and for up to five hours a week.

- Annual Meeting Results
 - Clarification on officer terms for 2025 with the change of the fiscal year, the current term year will end in December 2025 instead of February 2026.
 - Immigrant Welcoming Top 5:
 - Option 3. Support the passage by the U.S. Congress of legislation to protect DACA recipients from deportation and to secure
 - Option 5. Provide Know Your Rights and Active Bystander Trainings to educate members
 of the congregation and the broader community about the rights of undocumented
 immigrants and their families and strategies for defending their legal rights.
 - Option 7. Assist undocumented immigrants and their families, with appropriate consultation from legal counsel as needed, to secure access to the essentials of life, including housing, health care, mental health services, housing, food, clothing, and education.
 - Option 10. Partner with schools to support students and their families under threat of deportation.
 - Option 11. Provide resources to legal and other assistance to lawful permanent residents seeking to become naturalized U.S. citizens.
- Clarification on the Budget presented at the annual meeting. This budget was for the time period of March 1, 2025 December 31, 2025, to align with our updated fiscal year.

Motion to adjourn at 7:51pm passed.

Mental Health Awareness Month: Sermon Series Featuring Imagine Dragons



This May, we're exploring faith and mental health through Scripture and the music of Imagine Dragons. Their lyrics—featured in songs like "Demons," "Thunder," and "Whatever It Takes"—give honest voice to struggles with identity, pain, and resilience.

Lead singer Dan Reynolds has spoken openly about living with depression, anxiety, and chronic illness, saying:

"There's nothing weak about struggling with mental health.

The strongest thing you can do is keep going."

Each Sunday, we'll reflect on these themes through a spiritual lens, discovering how God meets us in our fear, fuels our healing, and calls us beloved—exactly as we are.

- May 4: "What We Carry: Grace for the Haunted" We reflect on the internal "demons" we carry shame, regret, or fear and the God who feeds us anyway. Inspired by John 21 and Imagine Dragons' "Demons," we affirm: healing begins when we are honest about what hurts.
- May 11: "Held in the Noise: Whatever It Takes to Keep Going" When the world is too loud and our minds are full, the Shepherd calls us by name. Drawing from John 10 and "Whatever It Takes" by Imagine Dragons, we reflect on resilience, survival, and divine care.
- May 18: Lay Reflection Karen Harkovich, "Instruction Booklet Not Included"
- May 25: "Born for More: Thunder and the Promise of Peace" Christ offers a peace the world cannot give—peace rooted in presence, resilience, and Spirit. With John 14 and Imagine Dragons' "Thunder," we claim our identity as beloved, bold, and born for more.
